Self-concept of Women Who Date a Married Man; (Sandi Kartasasmita, M.Psi); Undergraduate Program in Psychology, University of Tarumanagara. (141 pages; R1-R5).

A woman who turns into early adulthood, has several development tasks, one of them is looking for and selecting partner to get married, which getting through by dating. Although, the relationship does not always involve partner with single status. Part of women in our society are having a relationship with a married man. This kind of relationship is common in this society, however this phenomenon is opposite with society's norms, because it means the man is having affair. Many times, the women are considered as "home-breaker". The negative judgements from society makes the women have difficulties in having relationship on daily activities, and will influence their self-concept. Self-concept is the way of individual to see his/her self, which has three aspects: knowledge, expectation, and evaluation. This research used the methods of interview, with three respondents, from 27 to 30 years, who date a married man. This research was held for two and a half months, from April 5th, 2008 to June 14th, 2008. The result of this research indicates two respondents have a negative self-concept and a respondent has a positive self-concept.
