

ABSTRACT

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Self-efficacy Differences Judging from Parenting Style (Study on Students of High School X and Y in North Jakarta); Erik Wijaya, M.Si.; Undergraduate Program in Psychology, Tarumanagara University, (i-xii; 64 pages, R1-R4, Appdx 1-45)

Self-efficacy is a person's belief that he can control situation, achieve something, and bring positive results. Initial formation of self-efficacy on every person is influenced by parenting style (Bandura, 1997). Parenting style is a pattern of parental attitude shown as a response, method, and implementation of consideration and decision to interact, educate, and gain compliance from the child. The result shows significant differences in self-efficacy in terms of parenting style. Participants also has a high level of self-efficacy. Students which nurtured by authoritative mothers and authoritarian fathers have the highest self-efficacy compared to other types of parenting style.
