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Self-efficacy is a person's belief that he can control situation, achieve something,

and bring positive results. Initial formation of self-efficacy on every person is

influenced by parenting style (Bandura, 1997). Parenting style is a pattern of

parental attitude shown as a response, method, and implementation of

consideration and decision to interact, educate, and gain compliance from the

child. The result shows significant differences in self-efficacy in terms of parenting

style. Participants also has a high level of self-efficacy. Students which nurtured by

authoritative mothers and authoritarian fathers have the highest self-efficacy

compared to other types of parenting style.
