Resiliency and attitudes toward substance use in adolescence. Study on 101 students on Trinitas Junior High School, Jakarta Barat. (Putu Tommy Y. S. Suyasa, M.si. Psi.); Study Program S1 Psychology. University of Tarumanagara. (pages 90 + P1-P6)

This research aimed to find out correlation between resiliency and attitudes toward substance use. This research also hope to bring out more details about relationship between resiliency dimension and attitudes toward substance use. Dimensions of resiliency are protective factors, risk factors and personal factors. Subjects are students of Trinitas Junior High School (N=101). Data collected using two measurement: one to measure resiliency and the other to measure attitudes toward substance use. Data analyzed using product moment correlation from Pearson. The result suggested that from 3 dimensions of resiliency, risk factors found out to have positive correlation with attitudes toward substance use, while protective factors and personal factors did not have correlation. Generally, concluded that there is no correlation between resiliency and attitudes toward substance use.
