

ABSTRACT

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The relationship of *self-esteem* with conformity in the late adolescent who choose the Faculty of Psychology at the University of T at Jakarta. (Niken Widiastuti, M. Si., Psi & Dra. Ninawati, MM). Bachelor degree in psychology, Tarumanagara University (page 1-69, P1-P3, L1-L73).

Self-esteem is the evaluation of individual self to his or herself, in both positive or negative aspect. Respecting themselves and having self-confidence are the characteristic of individuals who have high self-esteem. On the other hand, individuals who are not respect themselves and have no confidence are the characteristic of individuals who have low self-esteem. Conformity is the individual's behavior which is modified to adjust the behavior of the group. The aim of researchers conducting research is to investigate the relationship of self-esteem with conformity late adolescence who choose the Faculty of Psychology at the University of T. The study was conducted at 206 late adolescents, aged between 17 to 21 years old, who enrolled at the University of T. This study uses nonexperimental quantitative methods. Results of data analysis using Pearson correlation test showed that $r(206) = -.164$ and $p = .018$. It can be concluded there is a negative and significant relationship between self-esteem with conformity in choosing a Faculty Psychology.
