

ABSTRACT

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The Correlation Between Self Acceptance With Aggressive Behavior in Adolescent at Junior High School; Naomi Soetikno, M.Pd, P.si.; Undergraduate Program in Psychology, Tarumanagara University, (i-xi; 64 pages; R1-R6; Appdx 1-31).

The aim of this study is to know the correlation between self acceptance with aggressive behavior in adolescent at junior high school. Aggressive behavior is a conscious or deliberate behavior by someone who conducted in form of verbal and physical as well as aiming to hurt or harm another person, causing pain and trauma, both physically and psychologically. Self acceptance is a positive self-image and acknowledge the advantages and disadvantages, as well as understand the desire and willingness of self in objective view. Subjects were early adolescent aged 12 to 15 years. The study is assessed 370 subjects of junior high school in Jabotabek. The results is using Chi Square correlation design showed that hostile aggression has a Chi Square value = 1266.656 and $p = .000$. Physical aggression has a Chi Square = 1266.656 dan $p = .000$. The result showed a positive correlation between self acceptance with aggressive behavior, either indicators of hostile aggression and physical aggression in adolescent.
