

ABSTRACT

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The Role of Time Pressure towards Work Engagement (Study on Online Media Journalists in Jakarta); Dr. P Tommy Y. S. Suyasa, Psikolog. & Linda Wati, M. Psi., Psikolog. Undergraduate Program in Psychology, Tarumanagara University, (i-xi; 32 pages, R1-R4, Appdx 1-15)

The aim of this research is to find the role of time pressure towards work engagement on online media journalists in Jakarta. This research involve 51 participants using convenience sampling technique. The result of this research shows that time pressure do not predict work engagement towards online media journalists in Jakarta. The implication from job demands has been discussed. Limitations of the research and suggestions for the next research have been given. The result of regression test showed that time pressure acts on work engagement of $r^2 = 0\%$, $F(1, 51) = 0.002$, $p = 0.964 > 0.05$. Time pressure ($\beta = -0.008$, $p > 0.05$), which means time pressure does not predict work engagement on online media journalists in Jakarta.
