ABSTRACT

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The Correlation between Father Involvement Dimention on Nurturing with Emotional Autonomy in Adolescent; Sesilia Monika, M.Psi. & Erik Wijaya, M.Si.; Undergraduate Program in Psychology, Tarumanagara University; (i-ix; 61 pages, R1-R5, Appdx 1-28)

Emotional autonomy can be affected by family, including father, who still involve on aspects of adolescent's life. Person with emotional autonomy become aware of self and parents are unique individuals (Beyers, Goossens, Van Calster, & Duriez, 2005). Nurturant fathering is the quality of relationship, reported father involvement is adolescent's retrospective perspective on their father involvement in their life, and desired father involvement is level of father involvement which are desired (Finley & Schwartz, 2004). The objective from this study is to find out the relationship between dimensions of father involvement and emotional autonomy. The subjects were 401 adolescents aged between 12-14 years old and lives with their father in Jakarta. This study is using correlational design of non-experimental quantitative method with convenience sampling and data analysis used Spearman correlation test. Based on the data analysis, the conclusion is nurturant fathering, reported father involvement, and desired father involvement dimension have significantly negative correlation with separation. While nurturant fathering and reported father involvement have significantly negative correlation with detachment but don't have correlation with desired father involvement.
