ABSTRACT

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Social skills are a set of learning abilities that allow an individual to interact competently

and precisely in a particular social context (VanderBos, 2007). Social skills need to be

owned by homeschooling students to be able to socialize outside the scope of

homeschooling. Homeschooling is the formal instruction of students in their homes or other

personal settings, often by both parents, teachers or a tutor. This study aims to provide an

overview of social skills in students who have attended a homeschool education program.

In-depth interviews were conducted on five men and four women (14 to 18 years old) who

were homeschooled. This study lasted for five months, starting from February 2019 to June

2019. The results of this study indicate that the nine subjects have social skills in different

ways. In general, the nine subjects have social skills in themselves.
