Reviewer #1: The paper may be revised in large part. Specially the most important part may be totally re-written.

1. The topic of the paper should focus on the impact of higher US tariffs against China on FDI inflows to ASEAN during the USA-China Trade War. Thus the title of paper may be changed to the following:
 How important are the US-China trade war to FDI flows into ASEAN countries?
2. Empirically methods used may not good. The better one is to test directly how US tariffs divert its imports from China to ASEAN and therefore divert FDI from China to ASEAN. Vietnam is a typical example.
3. Theoretical framework may focus on tariffs as trade barrier that affect FDI substantially.
4. Comparisons of two sub-periods would be useful: 2008-2018 (without US-China trade war), 2018-2023 (with US-China trade war).
5. the conclusion needs rewrite and discuss more on implications of results
